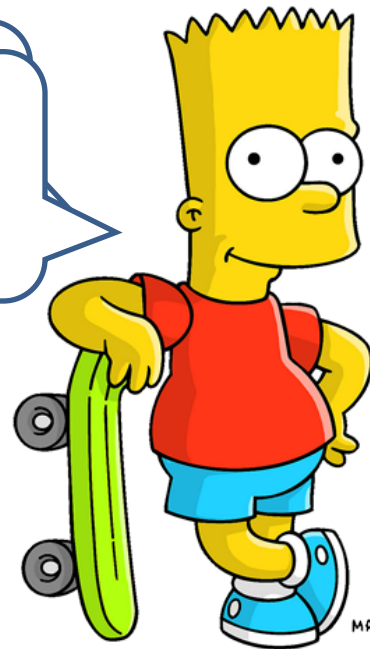
Stand up, chairs under.



The Manchester skyline represents the fact that we all live in the Manchester area.

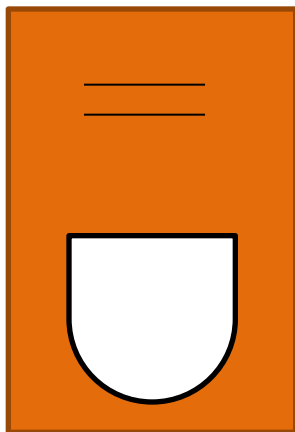


The cross represents the fact that **most** of us considered ourselves to be Christian.
