### Appetizer: DGP Week 6

**Essential Question:** Can you recognize the parts of speech in the sentence this week?

**Sentence:** my girls will you give them your breakfast as a Christmas present

**Directions:** : identify parts of speech including noun (type), Pronoun (type, case, person), verb (type and tense), adverb, adjective, article (definite or indefinite), preposition, conjunction (type), interjection, infinitive, gerund, participle.

**Sentence Source:** *Little Women* by Louisa May Alcott

#### Instruction:

- This is a good review on pronouns: Identify type, case, and person. Don't forget to identify as singular or plural.
- Types of pronouns: personal, demonstrative, interrogative, relative, demonstrative, and indefinite, reflexive and intensive
- Cases of personal pronouns: nominative, objective, possessive
- Person: first, second, third. These can be singular or plural
- Nominative personal pronouns are used as subjects and predicate nominatives
- Objective personal pronouns used as DO, IO, AND OP
- Possessive pronouns are to be distinguished from possessive adjectives
- Demonstrative pronouns can also act as demonstrative adjectives
- A pronoun that ends in "Self" is reflexive if it can be removed from the sentence AND the sentence meaning changes.

**Soup:** Grammar

**Essential Question:** Can you use independent and subordinate clauses?

**Materials:** Holt Grammar text p. 165-178, notes, pen

**Directions:**

- Read and take notes p. 165-178
- Complete Ex. 6 (p. 172) and Ex. 8 (p. 175) by 30 September.
- Complete Ex. 10 (p. 177) and Ex Rev. A (178) by 4 October.

**Instructions:**

1. All clauses have a subject and a predicate.
2. Independent clauses may stand on their own such that they complete a simple sentence.
3. Dependent clauses must have a subject and a verb, but cannot stand on their own.
4. Adverb Dependent clauses begin with subordinating conjunctions and modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs.
5. Adjective dependent clauses begin with relative pronouns and modify nouns or pronouns.
6. Noun Clauses begin with noun clause identifiers (NCI) and act as subjects, predicate nominatives, direct objects, indirect objects, or objects of the predicate

**Essential Question:** Can you recognize and use vocabulary words, their synonyms, and antonyms?
