## B. The Babylonians

1. Sargon of Agade (2334-2279 B.C.)
  - a. Founded Akkad Region
  - b. Created Akkadian lang.
2. Amorites (c. 2000 B.C.) find Babylon on Euphrates River
3. Hammurabi (c. 1792-1750)
  - a. Makes Babylon the capital of Empire
  - b. Famous for legal code 282 laws

## C. Ancient Egypt G. *"The Gift of the Nile"*

1. Developed the same time as Sumerians along the Nile in Africa
2. Nile is the source of food and trans.
3. Divided into Upper Egypt (S) and Lower Egypt (N)
4. 2900 B.C.=Pharoahs
  - a. Early Dynastic period (c. 2925-c 2575 B.C.)
  - b. Old Kingdom (c. 2575-2130 B.C.)
  - c. Middle Kingdom (c. 1938-1600 B.C.)
  - d. New Kingdom (c. 1540-1075 B.C.)
5. Some invasions, yet protected by land and sea barriers
6. Pharoahs=Gods
